



Dr. Adam C. Levine is a Professor of Emergency Medicine and International and Public Affairs at Brown University. Dr. Levine currently serves as the Associate Dean of Global Health Equity within the Brown University Division of Biology and Medicine. Dr. Levine received his Medical Doctorate from the University of California, San Francisco and his Masters of Public Health from the University of California, Berkeley before completing specialty training in Emergency Medicine and Humanitarian Studies at Harvard University. He has previously led research and training initiatives in East and West Africa and South and South-East Asia. His federal and foundation-funded research focuses on

improving emergency care in low resource settings and during public health emergencies, while his clinical work focuses on the care of unsheltered populations in Rhode Island.
