## 15. RESEARCH SUMMARY

My research focuses on the use, comparative safety, and comparative effectiveness of medications in older adults, especially those who receive post-acute care in institutional settings or who reside in long-term care facilities. Since there is little or no evidence to support treatment decisions for many important subgroups of older adults receiving medications in clinical practice, my work seeks to generate such evidence. To achieve this overarching aim, I employ a diverse set of quantitative methods to large routinely collected administrative and clinical data.
