Proximal and Distal Protective Factors for Dating Violence among Child Welfare Involved Adolescents

Child welfare involved adolescents are 200% more likely to experience ADV perpetration and victimization. Yet, many child welfare involved adolescents also display resilience against ADV. This study uses intensive sampling of social media data in concert with self-report assessments of interpersonal characteristics to examine proximal and distal protective factors for ADV among child welfare involved adolescents.
