Implementing Patient Navigators in Substance Use Clinics to Facilitate Linkage and Retention to Dual HIV/PrEP and Addiction Services

This Type 2 Hybrid Effectiveness-Implementation Trial will use mixed methods to evaluate the effectiveness and implementation of a patient navigator-based intervention within outpatient substance use treatment facilities on care continuum outcomes including HIV testing, linkage to dual care services, retention in dual care services, and patient clinic outcomes. A 6- site, stepped wedge design that randomly assigns the order in which clinics receive the intervention will be used.
