CURRICULA DEVELOPED

- 2023 *Tolerating Uncertainty in Psychiatry* This seminar series was designed to enhance PGY1-4 psychiatry residents' abilities to recognize and tolerate sources of uncertainty in psychiatric training. The series employs principles of group mentalizing process to enhance residents' ability to reflect critically on the impact of uncertainty on the professional development and clinical duties of psychiatrists. This curriculum was presented as a workshop session at the 2025 AADPRT national conference. San Francisco, CA. March 2025.
- 2024-2026 *Psychotherapy Supervision* This series was developed as a monthly recurring seminar for supervisors of psychotherapy training in the Brown University Adult Psychiatry Residency. The series aimed to enhance supervisors' skills in teaching psychotherapy, increase comfort with discussions of identity and intersectionality within supervision, and ensure alignment of the training experience with ACGME specialty milestones. The curriculum was approved by the Department of Psychiatry and Human Behavior's education committee to satisfy the faculty development requirement for re-appointment and promotions.
