COURSES AND EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT

Instructor, PH2060 Qualitative Methods in Health Research in 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021. Co-instructors have been Terrie Fox Wetle, Abigail Harrison and Emily Gadbois

Learning objectives: Introduce qualitative approaches to data collection and analysis in health research. Methods covered include: participant observation, key-informant interviews, focus groups, innovative data collection strategies, and non-obtrusive measures. Various sorts of data and strategies for collection and analysis of information will be discussed and contrasted to identify strengths, limitations and applications. Students will work on applied projects to develop interview templates, to experience qualitative data collection, to develop interviewing and observational skills, to learn transcript management and analysis using computerized software, to triangulate among qualitative and quantitative data sources, and to prepare reports of qualitative studies.

Instructor, Translation of Research into Clinical Practice: An Introduction to Quality Improvement for the Medical Practitioner, 2013→present

Course goals are: To introduce fellows to the basic research and analytic skills required to translate research into clinical practice principles of quality improvement; to prepare fellows to conduct a relevant research project and/or audit of their clinical practice; and to prepare fellows to be able to present their research/audit.

I am co-director of this weekly course with David Dosa, MD. As part of this course, I give at least 2 lectures on qualitative methods, conduct an audit of fellows' projects and evaluate final presentations.

Creator and instructor, Care Transitions and Communication: Patients' Perspectives, 2013.

This 3-hour course for Internal Medicine interns was based on my research with nursing home patients about their care transitions. The interview data formed the basis of my curriculum for 1st year residents in the one-month mandatory Geriatrics clinical block rotation at RI Hospital and featured an 88-year old interview respondent as a guest speaker. I delivered the course three times: March 8, 2013, April 5, 2013, May 3, 2013.
