COURSES OFFERED

Word for Word: Linguistic Principles in English-Chinese Translation This seminar, offered to students with at least two years of training in the Chinese language, approaches translation through linguistic studies in tandem with translation practices.

The History of the Chinese Language A linguistics seminar that offers an overview of the history of the language to students either with or without prior knowledge of the language. The course covers all aspects of the language, including philology, phonology, dialectology, and grammar.

Returnees in China's Modernization A cultural course studying the history of the returnees since the Opium War, with the focus on the impact of the latest cohort in China's Reform and Opening era.

Far Eastern Civilizations (in translation) A lecture course providing an overview of the cultures of the Far East, with an emphasis on China, Japan and Korea.

Gods and Heroes in Far Eastern Literature (in translation) A lecture course employing East Asian masterworks to examine the heroic and divine dimensions of various East Asian literary traditions.

Love and Nature In East Asian literature (in translation) A lecture course designed to introduce students to East Asian culture and literature.

The Structure of Chinese (in English) A linguistics course designed to provide and overview of the modern Chinese language. It introduces the phonological and grammatical structures of Mandarin Chinese, as well as the relationship between mandarin Chinese and Chinese dialects.

Literary Chinese A course designed to teach classical Chinese to students with no prior knowledge of Chinese language.

Elementary Chinese An introductory Chinese language course emphasizing writing, reading and speaking skills.

Zhongji kouyu An intermediate-level course designed to expand the students' practical vocabulary and conversational skills.
